

1 FAMILY

You are looking for 9 FAMILY vocabulary. 5 are written across and 4 are vertical.

- To find the vocabulary word, you ask if there is a letter in a certain square, for example: *Is there a letter in 1 and A?* Your partner will answer YES or NO.
- Your partner has the information you need at the top of their sheet, and you have the information they need at the bottom of this sheet.

DETAILS

- Always use the words on the left first, then the words on the top, for example 1 and A, 2 and B.
- You ask 4 questions, then your partner asks 4 questions.
- Guess whenever you want, but if you guess wrong, you lose a turn.
- It will go something like this:
LEE: *Is there a letter at RIGHT and FAN?*
KIM: *Did you say VAN or FAN?*
LEE: *FAN, like to move the wind.*
KIM: *Wait. Did you say RIGHT or NIGHT?*
LEE: *I said RIGHT, like in correct*
KIM: *No.*
LEE: *Fine! Is there a letter at LAY and FAN?*
- If you find a square with a letter in it, ask about the square above or below it, or to the right or left. The more letters you know, the easier it will be to guess.
- The better you get at pronouncing, the faster the game goes. *Cool.*
- After you finish, talk about your personality. Your parents. Last weekend, next weekend. Talk about whatever.

HANDY PHRASES:
